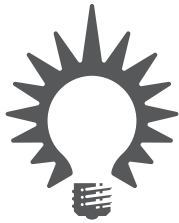


What is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)?

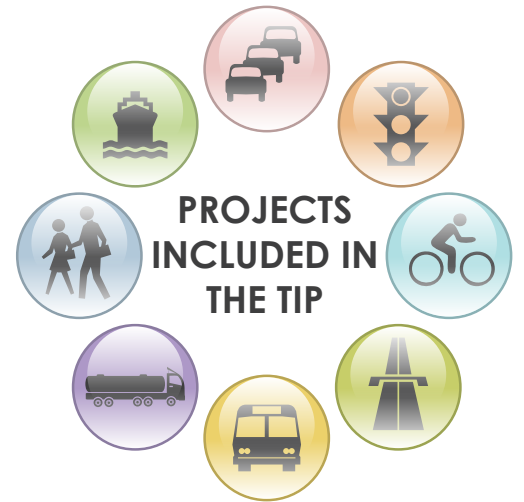


The **Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)** is a four-year, short-range program, which provides a prioritized list of federally funded multimodal transportation projects within the Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA). The TIP supports the long-range vision of the **Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)**.

Why is the TIP important?



The TIP is more than just a wish list of projects, it must remain realistic in terms of available funding (*"fiscally constrained"*). The TIP shows how transportation funds will be invested over four years by state and local partners. The TIP is the region's way of allocating its limited resources among the various transportation needs of the region.

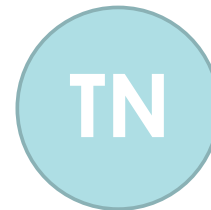
How is the TIP developed?

The TIP is created through a multi-step process with local partners and the public. Eligible project sponsors submit project applications during the *"Call for Projects"* for inclusion in the TIP. The Memphis MPO is responsible for selecting and programming projects using adopted criteria, which align with the region's goals and objectives.

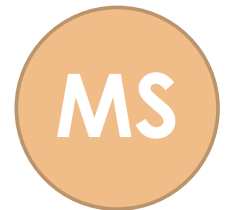

How can you participate in developing the TIP?

Opportunities for involvement will occur throughout the development of the FY 2020-23 TIP. Eligible project sponsors applying for funding will hold public meetings before the application deadline to inform residents of potential projects. 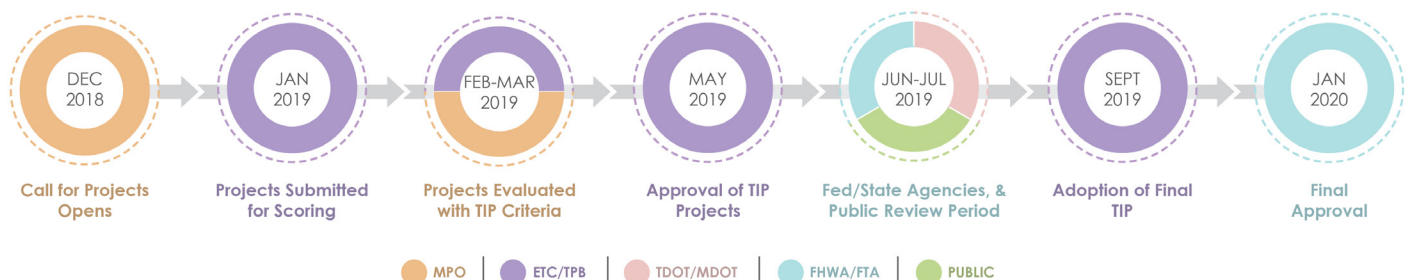

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FY 2020-2023 TIP Development Timeline

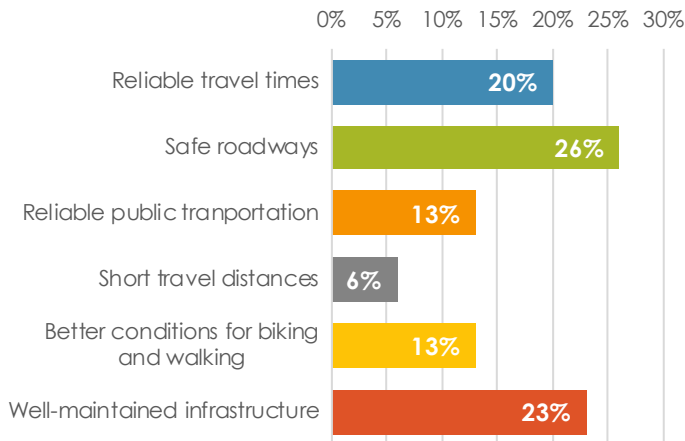




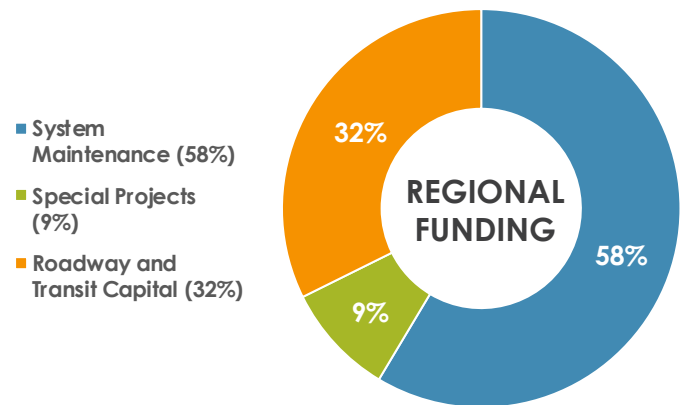
What have we heard in Livability 2050?

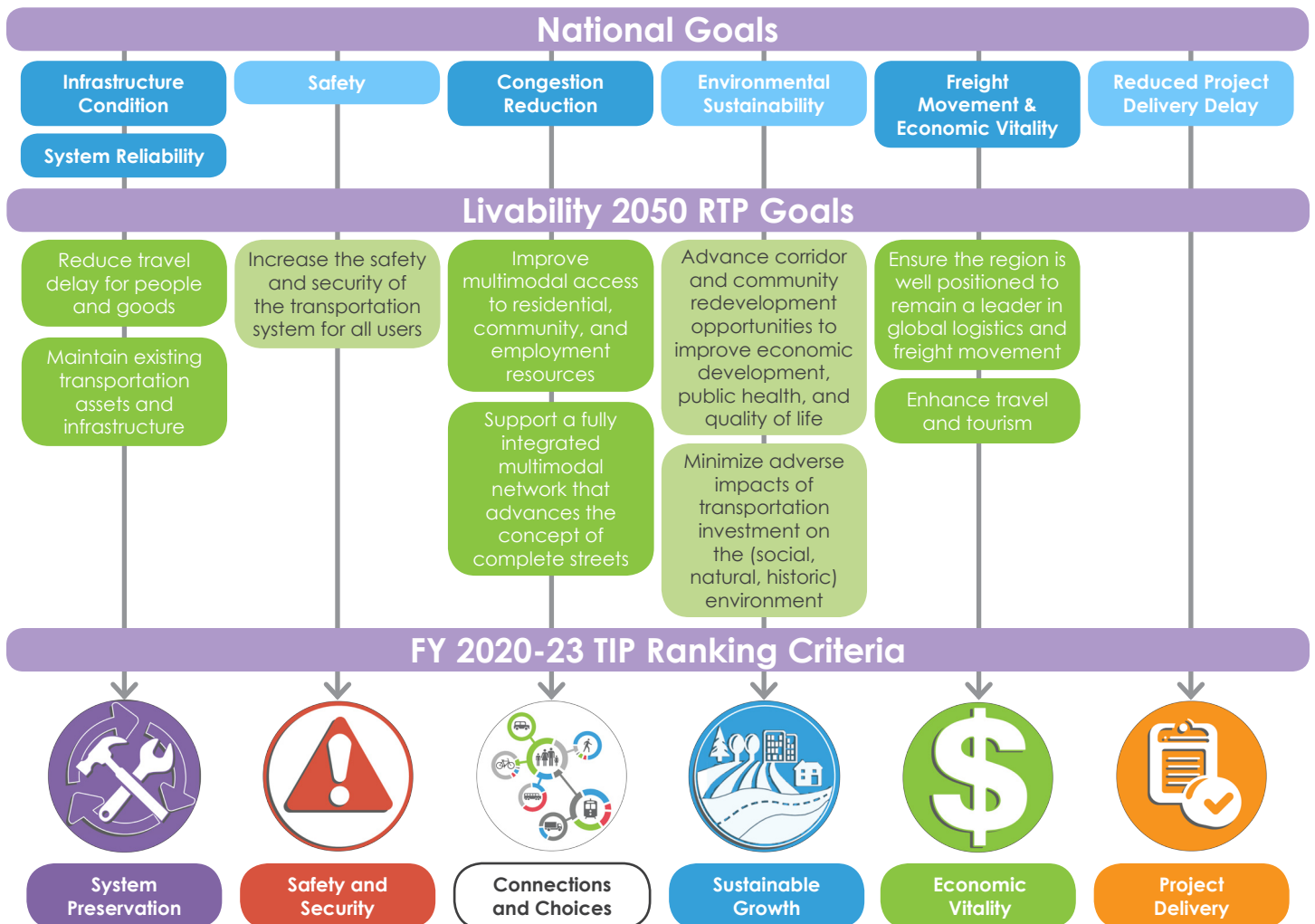
Which of the three (3) do you value the most?
